HAND QUILTING WITH CAROL KOCIS: This will teach you the basics of hand quilting as well as a NEW TECHNIQUE! You will need a thimble to comfortably fit your middle finger. Wearing the thimble around the house will help you get used to using it. You should look for a thimble with deep dimples. (I wear the pink plastic thimble due to the deep dimples.)

CASSEROLE CARRIER WITH GAIL CARL AND MILLIE MYERS: This is your opportunity to make a casserole cover so that when you bring your dish to a covered dish event, yours will stand our not only for the delicious food you've made, but for the great cover it comes wrapped in.

ROTARY CUTTING WORKSHOP WITH ANITA ROWELL: This workshop will be a learning experience to give you a more accurate cut with your rotary cutters and rulers. We'll learn how to make a more accurate seam allowance. Remember, the key to a perfect size block starts with a perfect cut and a perfect seam allowance.



THREAD THERAPY WORKSHOP DVD

If you missed this DVD workshop in February or want to look at it again, please contact Shirley Swenson to borrow the DVD. You'll be amazed how much there is to learn about thread, needles, and tension. The two-hour DVD, which features Bob Purcell, President of Superior Threads and self-certified Threadologist, can be played on a DVD player or on a computer with a DVD drive. LOOKING AHEAD TO SPRING GUESTS

Spring is a great time to learn some new techniques and skills, and we have two unique guests to help us: Kari Carr of New Leaf Stitches and Carol Gilham-Jones, author of <u>Tile Quilt</u> Revival.

KARI CARR

This former Home Economics teacher from the beautiful Minnesota Lakes Country has enjoyed working with textiles since she was a little girl. After developing the popular notion, Clearly Perfect Angles, Kari's New Leaf Stitches quilt-design company prospered to the point where she was able to resign her teaching position and pursue her passion full-time.

Her work has been featured on the covers of several leading quilt magazines in the U.S. and France.

Kari has spoken to groups as well as taught classes across the country and at International Quilt Market. A few of the most common evaluations given by Kari's students:

- "The most helpful teacher I've ever had."
- "Excellent teacher!"
- "Really fun good and interesting techniques."
- "Thrilled to have a project that can be finished in one day."

Her book, Just around the Corner, Quilts with Easy Mitered Borders, was published in 2011. (See Shirley Swenson to preview a copy of this wonderful book with many Spring-inspired quilts, or look for it at Style Fabrics.) Kari is best known for her technique of an easy mitered-frame border (and variations thereof) and the very popular Clearly Perfect Angles (CPA) stitching template. With the CPA, you can sew 45 degree angles accurately and efficiently without marking your fabric. For Kari's workshops, the CPA template is optional, but recommended.

We can preorder the CPA template for a reduced price of \$7 (no shipping and no tax). Retail price is \$10. Contact Shirley Swenson to preorder and prepay the Clearly Perfect Angles notion. You can see videos of the

CPA in use at http://www.newleafstitches.com/, as well as peruse Kari's available patterns.

FULL DAY WORKSHOP, "COUNTY FAIR" (featuring Clearly! They're Perfect Angles): Friday, April 20, 9:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. at Grace Church, (quilt size 40" x 40").

Limit: 20 students, Cost \$35 for Wiltwyck members (\$40 for non-members), includes \$7 pattern.

The excitement of little children and old friends. Great food and twirling rides. Flowers and summer warmth....it's the County Fair! If you want a little change of pace... try this pattern. You may even win a blue ribbon.

This pattern is unique because it was developed to showcase fun and different ways to work with angles. The class relies heavily on the Clearly Perfect Angles notion (however, can be done without....time will be needed for those people to draw lines).

"THE SPROUTING AND GROWTH OF NEW LEAF STITCHES" LECTURE AND TRUNK SHOW: SATURDAY, APRIL 21, AT GRACE CHURCH.

This lecture and trunk show gives a peek into Kari's business as she tells the story of New Leaf Stitches. From the planting and sprouting of her ideas to the full bloom of her business, you will enjoy the journey her quilts take you on. She will share stories about writing her first quilt book, designing patterns, developing an innovative notion and the excitement of seeing her work on the covers of magazines! There will also be a glimpse of what's ahead for New Leaf Stitches.

HALF-DAY "BEAUTY BRIGHT" WORKSHOP: SATURDAY, APRIL 21, AT GRACE CHURCH

(quilt size: 16° x 16°).Limit: 20 students. Cost: \$25 for Wiltwyck members (\$30 for non-members), includes \$7 pattern.

Starry Night, Beauty Bright! The stars shine on this quilt just right. This three-hour workshop features Kari's easy mitered border technique with two different colors for the full border.

The pattern makes three sizes: 16", 32", and 48".

FULL-DAY FIRST DUTCHESS QUILTERS "OUR TOWN - AN M&M MYSTERY" WORKSHOP: THURSDAY, APRIL 19.

Inspired by the beauty of a small Minnesota town, you will find this unique quilt a pleasure to sew and display. Stroll along with the fun, easy steps to decipher the clues and finish this M&M (Manageable Mystery) size quilt. New and fun techniques make solving this mystery intriguing. CAROL GILHAM-JONES

Carol hails from Lawrence, Kansas, and is a good friend of Barbara Brackman. Carol's quilts have appeared in numerous publications (at least eight times in Quilter's Newsletter). Her book, Tile Quilt Revival: Reinventing a Forgotten Form, written with Bobbi Finley, was published in 2010. Carol occasionally writes about tile quilts at carolgilhamjones.blogspot.com.

What are tile quilts? In the last third of the 19th century, there was a distinctive genre of appliqué quilts made with narrow lines of background fabric showing between the appliquéd pieces. **Because** the narrow lines of background fabric "arout" resemble and the appliquéd pieces "tiles," these quilts generally are called tile quilts.

"TILE QUILTS: THEN AND NOW" LECTURE AND TRUNK SHOW OF CONTEMPORARY TILE QUILTS: SATURDAY, MAY 19, AT GRACE CHURCH

HALF-DAY "MAKING A TILE QUILT BLOCK" WORKSHOP: SATURDAY, MAY 19, A1 AT GRACE CHURCH. Limit: 20 students. Cost: \$25 for Wiltwyck members (\$30 for non-members). No sewing machine required.

In this hand appliqué workshop, you'll begin your own tile quilt with a 10"-15" block that you'll prepare and begin to stitch. Emphasis will be on how a tile quilt differs from other types of appliqué and how to get started making a tile quilt rather than on how to appliqué. Fusing and machine appliqué will be touched on, in addition to hand appliqué, if there is interest. Carol will also discuss fabric choices and the use of large-scale contemporary prints in updating the traditional tile quilt form.

You'll learn the block-preparation method, a simple, direct way of working from a line-drawing pattern. This eliminates the usual hand-appliqué concerns of seam allowances, reversing images, and placement on the background. Carol will provide a pattern, or you can use a line drawing of your making of choice.
