QUILT DROP OFF FOR QUILT

TURNING AT SHOW

We will have an old fashioned 'Quilt Turning' occurring at the show on Sunday at 2:00PM. Usually quilts are stacked on top of a bed (or set of tables) then removed one at a time while being discussed. If you have a quilt and would be willing to have it as part of the Quilt Turning, please bring it to the September Meeting and give it to Sue Stepp who will be collecting them all for me. Please make sure that your name is on the guilt - if not on the label, please safety pin it on the quilt. Also please turn in a sheet of paper with additional helpful information including the name of the top maker, the quilter if different, and the Include any other interesting vear made. information to share with the audience such

as whether it was for a gift/occasion or any special technique used or names of unusual patterns. Quilts will be insured following the guidelines for all quilts entered in the show. Quilts will be returned immediately after the turning on Sunday or at the next guild meeting. QUILT SHOW BED TURNING

The Bed Turning will be Sunday at 2:00 p.m. at the Quilt Show. Tables will be laid out, the quilts will be all stacked, and the audience will be treated to a "mini-show" as the quilts are held up and discussed. But we need your guilts! Any guilt will do - but you must have a label on it to identify the guilt, especially who owns it. Any quilt you own that is begging to be taken out and shown is fair game – from the first guilt you ever made, to the one you are most proud of, to the one that means the most to you sentimentally. Sue Stepp will be accepting the guilts at the September 8 meeting. Please bring them in a plastic bag for safe transport. Your name, the name of your quilt(s), and a piece of paper describing why this quilt is important to you, is required. Please indicate maker, year made, current owner, reason quilt was made, any awards it garnered, anything that you want shared about your quilt(s). Maybe it was your child's most loved one and shows the wear and tear. Maybe it was made by a relative long gone, whatever you want the audience to know about your quilt. The quilts will be returned to you after the turning on Sunday or at the next Guild meeting if you are not present. Each quilt will be insured at the same method/value as guilts being entered for the show.

2012 MYSTERY QUILT

The time has come again to gather your supplies and go in search of an elusive quilt. What cutting and sewing will need to be done? What colors will it be? How will it ultimately look? We will follow the five clues each month starting in November and display the results of our efforts in June.

Considered an easy quilt, the size will be 50 x 60 without borders. Not scrappy this time, however largest piece is a one-yard. See Lesley to sign up in September or October. members of the group. Be sure your name is pinned to the block. There is no color specification just the theme of Civil War fabric. The same color does not have to be used for all the blocks each month. EX: If you have enough fabric to make 4 blocks, the remaining 6 can be a different color. June would be the last month to exchange and everyone should have a wonderful pile of 6 ½" blocks to create a very scrappy quilt.

GUILD BOUTIQUE

Remember to have a handmade item for the boutique. It can be sewn, knitted, crocheted, or anything as long as it is handmade. A couple of items or more are greatly appreciated.

SWAP A BLOCK

Using Civil War reproduction fabrics-a light tone or shirting print and a contrasting color, create a 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished Double 4 Patch to exchange each month with the others in your group. This is not like previous sampler swaps.

The way it works, if there are 10 people in the group each person would make 10 blocks, keep one and bring the other 9 to the next meeting to give to the other



WILTWYCK QUILTER'S GUILD SEPTEMBER 2012 RAFFLE BLOCK COUNTRY LANES

We will make a traditional scrappy 10" pieced block remonstrant of the Irish Chain.

PLEASE READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING THE BLOCK.

MAKE A PRACTICE BLOCK FIRST.

Fabrics:

Creamy muslin (not white) - eight 21/2"x21/2" and four 21/2"X41/2"

Assorted darks - nine 21/2"x21/2"

Sewing – all seams are 1/4"

Make four 4-patches using muslin and dark squares. Sew a dark to a light square and finger press toward the dark. Sew two pairs together, with darks in opposite corners. Press the 4-patch seam to one side. Check the size – it should be 41/2ⁿ.


- \times Sew a 21/2"x41/2" rectangle between pairs of 4-patches, as shown, to make the sides. Press toward the strip. Make two of these.
- \times Sew the remaining dark square between the last two the last two rectangles for the center strip. Finger press away from the square.
- $\times\,$ Join the two sides to the center strip. Press toward the center square.

The completed block measures 101/2⁷. Sign your name on a seam allowance.
