Pictorial and landscape quilter in October- Local art quilter Carol Weber visits Wiltwyck on October 19th. Carol has won many prizes for her art quilts, including several challenge pieces in which she interpreted famous art masters' paintings in fabric. She will present the lecture "The Making of a Landscape Quilt."

A half-day workshop, "Landscape Quilt Techniques," follows. Using your sewing machine, Carol will teach raw edge appliqué, thread painting, freestanding threadwork, and free motion quilting techniques. This workshop is not to be missed if you have always wanted to learn how to make spectacular art quilts.

Cost: \$20 for half-day workshop. Shirley Swenson is accepting signups now.

Wearables and quilt designer Lacey J. Hill of Golden Thyme Designs, who hails from Hillsdale, NJ, will be our guest in November. You can visit her Web site at <http://laceyjhill.com/>. She describes herself as "a self-professed Fabric-aholic. I love color and my stash reproduces spontaneously!" Sound familiar?

On Friday, November 15, she will teach a six-hour workshop, "Jackets that fit your style."

Business Meeting – May 18, 2013

Meeting was called to order at 10:02 AM by President Anita Rowell.

Minutes of the March meeting were read and accepted with motion from Leslie Gray and Dolly Wodin.

Treasurer: The balance of the General Fund is \$13,830.72. Sarah Kessenich made available the Proposed Budget. Treasurer's report was accepted.

Parliamentarian: Joan Polakoff read the slate of officers for the year 2013-2014. They are:

Anita Rowell - President; Dagmar Yaddow - Vice Pres.; Alice Maceyak - Rec. Secretary; D. Clark - Corres.Secretary; Pat Williams - Treasurer; Joyce Luby - Parliamentarian. It was accepted by unanimous voice vote.

Membership: There were 73 members present.

Library: Mary McLaughlin again asked members to check their book shelves for Guild Library books and return them without penalties imposed. She mentioned that members looking for specific books, should send her an E-mail so she can bring them to the meeting as well as the selected 3 crates that she normally brings.

Newsletter: There will be an abbreviated newsletter for June.

Quilt Show: Angee Opdyke announced that Kim Warren has accepted to chair the Publicity committee and now all the Quilt Show Committee Chairs are filled.

Program: May: Elections of new officers and year-end events. Diana Louie from the Village Fabric Shop in Red Hook, NY, presented a lecture on conservation and research of quilts and she examined quilts brought in by members and shared her insights and suggestions for conservation.

June: The meeting will be a combination of an "in house picnic" and Community sewing at the church. The remainder of **2013** – Sept, Oct., Nov. & Dec. - was briefly mentioned and further info will be printed in the Newsletter.

The Vermont Quilt Show bus trip will leave Thursday, 6/27 and return late on Friday, 6/28. September 15, 2013.

Hospitality: There will be coffee and snacks available before the meeting and the "In-House Picnic-Pot Luck" lunch will occur after the meeting.

Raffle Table: No one was in attendance from the Raffle Table committee, and only one ticket (those attending with a name tag) was drawn for a gift choice.

Community Service: Anita Rowell said that there will be a meeting on the Wed. after the June meeting.

Hall of Fame: Nominations for inductees need to be in by June 30 and the ceremony will be on September 15, 2013. Their annual picnic will be on July 15 with a pot luck dish and show-n-tell.

Old Business: There was none.

New Business: : The Proposed Budget, which the Executive Board approved, was amended: Shirley Swenson and Dagmar Yaddow moved that Hospitality should be allotted \$400 instead of only \$200 and Community Service was dropped from \$300 to \$100. The motion passed unanimously.

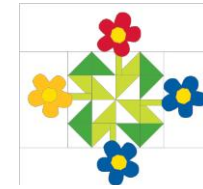
Newsletter: There will be an abbreviated June newsletter.

INFORMATION

If you would like to work on a Community Service quilt at home, the sizes are as follows:

Shelter quilts - 40" x 48" or larger with batting. Quilted or tied.

Nursing home quilts - 36" x 48" and no batting. Flannel backing is good for these because they do not slide off easily. Quilted or tied. Directions for the walker pockets and wheel chair pockets are on the Guild web page.

PRINTING ON TRACING PAPER OR FREEZER PAPER

I was looking for a way to print using my **INKJET** printer on tracing paper and freezer paper. I know that some people will iron freezer paper onto muslin and feed it through an Inkjet printer (don't do this with a Laser Printer) but this will weaken the hold that freezer paper has on other fabric after it is removed from the muslin. And of course this doesn't work with tracing paper. I played around with the problem and found I could simply tape the tracing paper or freezer paper to plain computer paper and thereby use the computer paper as a carrier for the other, flimsier paper. I use about 3" of tape along the top (the edge that feeds into the printer) and side edges of the papers to hold them together. I have a Lexmark Inkjet for which this works great. I haven't tried it on any other printers but I would definitely **NOT** use it on a Laserjet. The heat used to set the ink for Laserjets would melt the tape and freezer paper coating and cause a mess.
