FIBER ARTIST KATE THEMEL VISITS IN MAY

Kate Themel is an award-winning fabric artist and teacher living in Cheshire, Connecticut. Kate earned a Bachelor's Degree in Fine Art in 1992 and began using fabric as an artistic medium in 1996. Over the years, Kate has developed a distinct, painterly style in her compositions but remains linked to the quilting world by her use of simple, traditional materials: cotton fabrics, batting, and thread.

Kate has created custom fiber art for individuals

and corporate clients, and her unique fiber pieces have been exhibited in art galleries and museums from Boston to Botswana. Her work has been juried into international fiber art exhibitions such as Quilt National, Art Quilt Elements, and the Kagoshima Quilt Show in Japan. She earned the **Young Emerging Artist Award** and the **People's Choice Award** for her work in Quilt National '11.

Kate characterizes her work as follows: "**Who needs paint?** My paintings are made with layers of colored fabric and thread. I use the sewing machine to stitch fine details and create texture, like brushstrokes on canvas." Lecture and Trunk Show, "A Painter's Approach to Fiber Art": Saturday, May 17, 11:00 A.M.

Kate will show a 15-20 minute PowerPoint slide presentation, give a trunk show of her available quilts, and discuss the techniques and background stories for each quilt.

One-Hour Demonstration, "Building a Picture": **Saturday, May 17, starting about 1:00 p.m.** Limit: 25 students. Cost: \$10 for Wiltwyck members (\$15 for non-members). No sewing machine required.

This is a demonstration of Kate's raw edge, layering technique. Kate will show how she uses freezer paper to trace, cut, and layer pieces of fabric into a fiber art composition.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR 2 1/2" STRIPS

For those who had planned to do the Feb. workshop with those 2 1/2" strips, here are some directions if you want to do it on your own.

Lay out the strips in the order you want to sew them; ex: red, blue and green. Take the first half strip, at the end place the next on it right sides together as you would to make a bias strip and stitch. Cut off the triangle. Take the end and add another strip in the same manner and just keep adding strips until you have all 20 added. Then take the end strip to the FIRST strip and sew those together, until you get to the end again, repeat until you have a piece about the size of a crib quilt. Add a backing and you are done. You can add batting if you want. If you have any questions you can call me.

DID YOU KNOW.....ABOUT NATIONAL QUILTING DAY

Taken from the NQA newsletter.....

National Quilting Day is a special holiday, set aside to celebrate quilts and quiltmakers - past, present, and future. It gives us the opportunity to reflect with pride on the traditions of quilting and the contributions quiltmakers have made to their families and communities for many generations.

The National Quilting Association, Inc. began sponsoring National Quilting Day with a resolution passed by members attending the 22nd Annual Quilt Show in Lincoln, Nebraska, in June 1991. The third Saturday in March is officially designated as National Quilting Day, but over the years, observance of National Quilting Day has unofficially been expanded to the whole month of March!

PRESS RELEASE FROM THE PAST IN MEMORY OF RUTH CULVER

At his first meeting presiding as Wiltwyck Quilters Guild President, Larry Godinez acknowledged the neatly dressed founder sitting in the front row of the packed room. Ruth Culver stood to say a few words to the quilters who stood in appreciation. The focus of the morning's program was the Guild's October Quilt Show returning to SUNY Ulster on the 14th and 15th. This was the perfect opportunity for the president to announce to the group that the show, A Rainbow of Quilts, was dedicated to its founder, Ruth Culver. The show was held in 2006.

As a child, Ruth had learned traditional quilting from her mother for purely utilitarian reasons. Years later, when an Ulster Community College instructor learned that she knew how to quilt, he convinced her to teach a course on quilt making there. She constructed the curriculum, and started teaching the course in 1973. The now famous Ulster County Bicentennial Quilt that she coordinated still hangs in the college. Contributors to this project became the nucleus of the Wiltwyck Quilters' Guild, which she founded in 1977.

Ruth wrote two books, *How to Teach Basic Quilt-Making* for the American Quilters Association and *How to Hold a Quilt Show*. As a teacher and a codifier Ruth's influence was felt nationally as well as locally. For these reasons she was made a charter member of the Catskill Mountain Quilters Hall of Fame in 1982.

Ruth Culver died on December 16, 2013 at the Golden Hill Health Care Center, predeceased by her husband, Charles, and daughter, Veronica. She is survived by sons Michael Culver and wife Linda, Bob Dylan, and William Culver and wife, Kathy. She had 8 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF NATIONAL QUILTING DAY

In 1989, the Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society organized a "Quilters' Day Out" on the third Saturday of March to celebrate the rich tradition of quilting in Kentucky. In 1991, the NQA officers were so enthusiastic with the concept and success of "Quilters' Day Out" that they voted to take it to a national level.

The first National Quilting Day was observed in 1992 and since then it has grown into a global celebration for all quilt makers and quilt lovers. Helen Storbeck, one of the founders of National Quilting Day, wrote in *The Quilting Quarterly*, "Groups of quilters were encouraged to hold special events, publishers and shop owners were invited to sponsor promotions especially for quilters and it quickly became a grassroots endeavor with quilters in every part of the country participating. In the first year of National Quilting Day, quilters in other countries asked to participate. They were welcomed with open arms. As our feelings of a community network have evolved to include a world community, it is only appropriate that quilters and quilt lovers everywhere united to give recognition to the special art form."
