## BLOCK CHALLENGE FOR QUILT SHOW

You will create a block to illustrate a well-known book from any period of history. The title of the book may **NOT** appear on the block. It's up to you to create a block which brings the title to mind.

The block must be pieced or appliqued using at least three different fabrics. It must be sewn, not glued. The size of the block must be 18" X 18".

Embellishments are optional. You can add any trim to finish the block. These may be glued.

The block will be due at the September 2014 meeting. Name and phone number must be on the back of the block. The block MUST be turned in for display by 10:00 A.M. Late arrivals will not be accepted.

#### JOIN US FOR THE SUMMER TEA ON JUNE 21

Summer will be here before you know it, truly, and along with it our Summer Tea on June 21<sup>st</sup>, the first day of summer. Join us for a lovely day of food, flowers, and games.

We'll be playing a Quilt Guild Bingo game for prizes! You'll need to make a fabric game card following the instructions below, and be sure to bring buttons to cover your squares. Join the fun.

#### **GAME CARD INSTRUCTIONS**

#### Materials for one 10-1/2" card

Each fabric must be chosen from one of the following categories: batik, floral, geometric, heart, leaf, metallic, holiday, novelty, paisley, plaid, solid, star,

stripe, or 1930s print. Be sure you can clearly tell the category for each fabric square you choose, and only

use each category once for the same color. For instance, only include one yellow batik in your game card block. Use a black print for the center square. *Hint:* After your Bingo block is sewn together, make a drawing that lists which fabrics are located where in the block. For instance, the first column on the left, reading from top to bottom, might be: green geometric, green plaid, green stripe, green novelty, and green leaf. Likewise for the remaining 4 columns. From the 14 fabric categories listed above, you decide which five you're using in each column and in what sequence they are sewn together

Five 2-1/2" squares assorted yellow and orange prints

Five 2-1/2" squares assorted red prints

Five 2-1/2" squares assorted blue prints

Five 2-1/2" squares assorted green prints

Four 2-1/2" squares assorted pink and purple prints

One 2-1/2" square black print

Note: "assorted" means use different category fabrics for each square within a color.

#### **BLOCK ASSEMBLY**

- 1. Join 5 green print squares to make one column.
- 2. In the same manner make 1 blue column.
- 3. Join 5 green print squares to make one column.
- 4. In the same manner make 1 blue column.
- Join 2 pink/purple squares. Make a second pink/purple pair. Join one pink/purple pair to each side of the black square to complete the pink/purple column.
- Next make 1 red column.
- 7. Then 1 yellow/orange column.

Join columns, placing the green column in the far left, followed by the blue column, pink/purple column in the center, red column, and yellow column on the far right.

**Free quilting frame**: Norma Ellis has a plastic frame for hand-quilting that measures about 3-1/2 feet square. Please contact her at 518-537-5575 if you're interested.

**Quilts for Africa**: Please bring any quilts for Africa to the June meeting. Shirley Swenson is collecting them and will give them to Dr. Shirley Jones for the University of Albany students' summer trip to Africa.

### STUDIO 180 INSTRUCTOR DEBBIE KALENTY VISITS IN NOVEMBER

Debbie Kalenty, a certified Studio 180 (Deb Tucker) instructor from Flagtown, NJ, will visit us on November 15. She will briefly show each Studio 180 (Tucker) tool and present the type of unit it makes. Her trunk show will include both blocks and quilts.

A three-hour Hunter Star workshop follows the lecture. The cost is \$25. Each person must have (or purchase) the Hunter Star tool. No sharing tools. Max: 20 students. Sign up with Shirley Swenson.
