

Business Meeting – November 15, 2014

Treasurer: the balance of the General Fund was \$20,558.71. It was reported there were still outstanding checks from the quilt show.

Parliamentarian: Need was expressed for 3 nominating committee members. The following volunteered to be on the committee: Sharon Conlon, Peggy Smith, Gloria Frenza. The past president and parliamentarian will also be on the committee as directed by the by laws.

Past President: Pillows were collected from numerous guilds in the area totaling 176 to be used for breast cancer patients. The pattern was distributed at the Quilters Hall of Fame picnic this past summer. Requests were made for anyone interested in distributing them to see Barbara Alberstadt. Joan Perpetua suggested Reach for Recovery be contacted for distribution.

Historian: Leona has several pictures from the quilt show. As yet they have not been put on a disk to be put on the web site. She plans to have them available soon.

Hospitality: The refreshments will be set up in the kitchen from now on. It seemed to work well for this meeting and everyone was in agreement.

Librarian: no report

Mickey Krueger of Windham Fabrics will be joining us. His 20-minute presentation "Bringing Fabric to Quilt Shops" details the steps to get fabric from the design room to the factory to the quilt shop. Though

he won't have fabric for sale (so not to upset local quilt shops in the area), he will bring something for us.
