PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

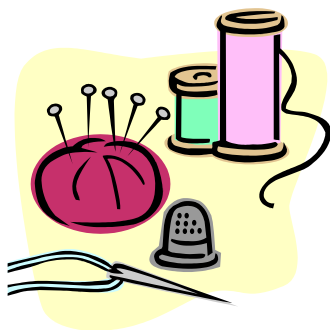
Hope everyone had a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

If you can't bring a sewing machine, bring a rotary cutter, medium size mat and a 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" Ruler and you can trim the blocks

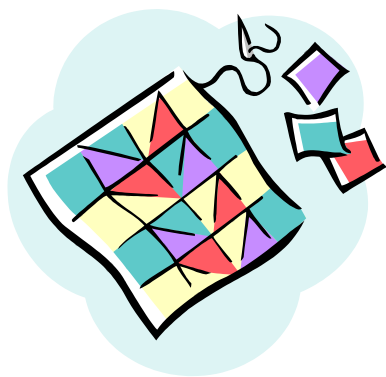

February Workshops

Disappearing Pinwheelswith Dagmar Yadow.

In this class there will be a lecture and demonstration of the technique. You can choose to listen without working on a project or bring a sewing machine if you want to work on your piece in class. Dagmar will have supply lists and information sheets to hand out at the January meeting.

Perfect Bindingswith Shirley Swenson.

Shirley will show us her excellent technique to get perfect bindings on our quilts. Those attending will need their sewing machines and a quilt in need of binding. Supply sheets will be available at the January meeting, for those who sign up.

Sensory Quiltswith Dolly Wodin

Dolly will show us some Sensory quilts, and will supply all the fabric and interfacing that might be needed. She will show us how to complete a 36" square quilts. These quilts are good for those suffering from Alzheimer's disease, many other forms of emotional problems, and even for very young children. They seem to bring comfort to those holding them. The quilts are always welcome at nursing homes, and by those who really need the tactile stimulation and memories they can evoke. If you know of someone who could benefit from one of these, why not bring some pieces of fabric from the clothing of that person, such as flannel shirting, bathrobe chenille, woolen parts of skirts or sweaters, to incorporate into the finished piece.

JANUARY 2015 RAFFLE BLOCK: Cotton Reels

We will make an traditional 10" scrappy block composed of squares and half-square triangles.

READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. MAKE A PRACTICE BLOCK FIRST.

Fabrics:

medium scraps: four different coordinating mediums, each 3½"x 3½"

very dark brown: eight 3"x3"

creamy muslin: four 3½"x 3½"

Preparation:

Draw a diagonal on the wrong side of each of the four medium 3½"x 3½" squares.

Sewing: use a ¼" seam.

Triangle squares: (4 sets of 2 each)

- With right sides together, match each marked square with a muslin one.
- Sew on both sides of the line. Cut apart on the line.
- Press away from the muslin.
- Square-up to 3"x3".

4-patches: (1 from each set)

- For each set, sew a brown square on the right edge of one of the triangle-squares and on the left edge of the other one. Pay careful attention to the direction of the diagonals. Press toward the square.
- Sew the sets together to form a 4-patch. Do not press yet.

Complete the Block:

- Lay out the 4-patches as shown with the colors arranged to your liking.
- Press the 4-patch seams down for the squares on the left and up for the squares on the right.
- Sew the upper pair and press to the left. Sew the lower pair and press to the right.
- Sew the upper and lower halves together. Press to one side.
- Press carefully and measure the block. It must measure 10½ " x10½ "
- Sign your name in a seam allowance.
