Let's continue to support each other and our quilting skills.

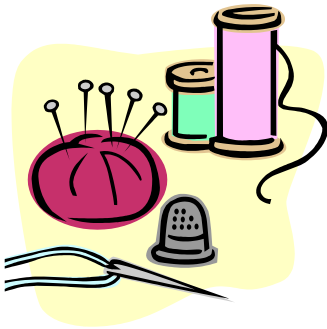

When planning your quilt for the shelter think *children* please use batting and either tie or machine quilt. And if you want, please put a red heart on it! For the nursing home: please plan for an adult, both female and male. NO Batting NO heart!!! Just a top and a backing. Lite weight corduroy or flannel. The size should be about 36-38" wide and about 48" long. Not too wide as they can get caught in the wheelchair wheels. Community service sewing is the Wednesday AFTER the regular meeting. Community service sewing is held at the Kingston Elks Lodge, 143 Hurley Ave., Kingston, at 9:00 until noon.

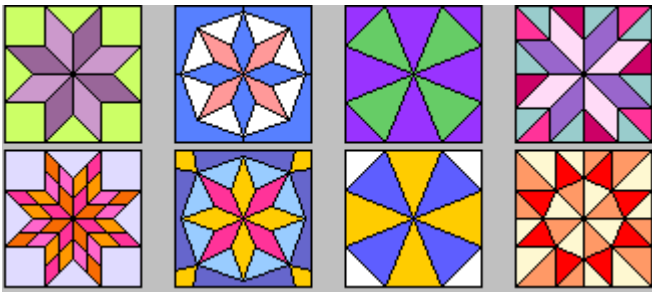
For June, please bring 19 bold blue squares. The following quilters have signed up: Assimus, Barnes, Cahill, Clark, Conlon, Frenza, Giardullo, Grambling, Kessenich, Luby, McLaughlin, Navarra, Rowell, Sitner, Stepp, Stessin, Urbon, Williams and Wodin.

A "*" following your name means you've signed up for the entire year.

Names with an '*' have signed up for the entire year. If you anticipate participating all season long, please place a star next to your name on next month's sign-up sheet. Those who want to sign up month by month are welcome to participate.

Fabric cut for the squares should be pre-washed, without selvages. Squares should be cut precisely 6 1/2" by 6 1/2", so that they can be readily used. The colors/themes will be different every month.

Unless called for, please don't use novelty fabrics. The squares will fit nicely into a one-quart Ziploc- type baggie, so please bring one with your name on it. Place your squares on top, and we will distribute your fabric and return your baggie to you filled with all the different fabrics!

Cuties are fat eighth cuts of fabric and shop owner Cathy Anderson and her daughter, Sarah Fabian, have been busy designing creative uses for these little cuts and developing lovely packets of coordinating cuties for their projects and ours. Sarah will introduce us to cuties and to some of her great designs at our June 18 meeting. Please come join us.

Minutes of the Business Meeting of the Wiltwyck Quilters' Guild, May 21, 2016

President, Theresa Pabon called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Joyce Luby told the membership that our Guild has given quilts to the family who had lost all of their possessions. They were all greatly appreciated. This is just one of the ways our Community Service quilts make a positive difference in the lives of others.

Anita Rowell, who chairs the Community Service program, said that there will be no Community Service sewing this coming Wed.

We were told that the nursing home that we are currently giving quilts to, is putting the patient's name on each quilt. Please continue to make quilts for Community Service, as it is hoped that each of us will donate at least one quilt a year. Anita will try to have information about how many quilts we have donated, in our next newsletter.

Pat Clark showed the membership the cutout for the front of the bibs we are asked to make. She also had a pattern for us to copy, handed out some already cut out bibs, and had a box of Velcro for us to use as fasteners on the bibs. We are asked to put a backing on these bibs, and can use flannel or terrycloth.

Please return these to Pat at the June meeting, or latest, by September.

Pat gave out the fabric for the membership to make "Yo-Yo"s for our upcoming Quilt Show for use on the quilts to hold signage.

Shirley Swenson told the group that she has sufficient quilts for the "Quilts for Africa" project that was initiated by Dr. Shirley Jones, a few years ago. Dolly Wodin has outdone herself, and donated 13 beautiful quilts she made to be given to recipients in Africa. We all applauded Dolly's generosity, talent, and hard work.

Theresa Pabon told the membership about the Board's decision to give a \$25.00 gift certificate to the high school students who are participating in the Moda Challenge, and about the Certificate of Accomplishment. These students will make pillows from their individual blocks.

Lesley Gray asked for a count of who is participating in our Challenge Block contest, and asked that the blocks be handed in early at our next meeting, for members to vote on them. They will be displayed at our October Quilt Show.

Lesley told us that there has been a correction to the information about the Quilters' Hall of Fame Quilt show in Roxbury. The new bookmarks are now available.

Angee Opdyke's fabric, notions, and 2 sewing machines, will be sold this month. For more information, call 518 678-6271.

Peggy Smith said that the forms are ready for us to pick up if we want to put handmade items for sale in our Boutique at our October Quilt Show. 10% of the money paid for each item, goes to our Guild.

Jackie Sittner needs more volunteers on the Friday before our show, to move the quilts from Grace Church, to the Rondout Valley School..

Betty Verhooven reminded us all of the Patchworkers' Quilt Show to be held August 13-14, 2016.

Susan Stessin Cohn told us that next month, we will be able to enjoy Sarah Fabien, of The Quilt Basket, give a talk on the use of "Cuties".

Jenny Bach told us that we had 81 members attending today, with 2 guests. She said that she has gotten many early renewals of membership, and that today is the last day to renew in order to be entered in the drawing for a free membership. 2016 Raffle Quilt – "Flowers of Friendship" beautifully pieced, hand appliqued and hand quilted quilt. 2016 CMQHoF Show – September 24 – 25, 10:00 – 4:00, Roxbury Arts Center, 5025 Vega Mountain Road, Roxbury, NY.

2016 Charity Project – Bibs. Similar to the pillowcase project, the HoF announced that bibs would be this year's charity project. Bibs should be turned in at the Fall (October) HoF meeting, so we will need to collect them at our (WQG) September meeting. Then they will be returned to be distributed to the charity of our choice.

WQG should determine where we want the bibs to go. The style depends on where we will be donating them – adult, child, large, small, slip over the head, Velcro closure, pocket in front or not, etc.

Bib Instructions:

If you are a Pinterest user and want to get ideas (Bride and Groom bibs – who knew?) then here is a link <https://www.pinterest.com/explore/adult-bibs/>

Lesley Gray has provided the simple instructions for an over the head bib: If using a heavier fabric, lining may not be needed, but if cottons are used a lining would make it better. Dimensions for an adult size would be 28" x 13". About 4 inches down from one narrow edge, cut a hole for the head. The hole for the child's size is about a 6" diameter; adult would be 7 – 7.5"
