CMQHOF Community Service Project – Bags

The annual project idea this year is bags. Wiltwyck can donate completed bags to the Poughkeepsie Children's Home. No particular size requirement, and making a regular tote bag, like a grocery tote, is fine. A half yard of fabric gives you enough for seam allowance and handles. Upholstery fabric makes beautiful, unlined bags. If you are using cotton fabric, they really do need to be lined which needs another half yard of coordinating fabric. On some, we used webbing strips for handles. It's a good clean out your stash' project.


Some of the kids come in to the home with just the clothes they are wearing. They fill the bags with toiletries, p.j.'s and stuffed toys. Children's prints are nice for the

younger ones, but the older ones could use bags of any print or fabric..

Everyone is welcome to sign up for individual months if you're interested in collecting fabrics of the established theme.


Names with an '*' have signed up for the entire year. If you anticipate participating all season long, please place

a star next to your name on next month's sign-up sheet. Those who want to sign up month by month are welcome to participate.

Fabric cut for the squares should be pre-washed, without selvages. Squares should be cut precisely 6 1/2" by 6 1/2", so that they can be readily used. The colors/themes will be different every month.

Unless called for, please don't use novelty fabrics. The squares will fit nicely into a one-quart Ziploc- type baggie, so please bring one with your name on it. Place your squares on top, and we will distribute your fabric and return your baggie to you filled with all the different fabrics!

Butterfly block is on hold. We will raffle it off in May so bring the completed block then.

WILTWYCK QUILTERS' GUILD

May 2017 Raffle Block: Dancing Squares

We will make a traditional 10 ½" unfinished block which appeared on p. 57 of the Spring 2010 issue of

Easy quilts.

READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. MAKE A PRACTICE BLOCK FIRST.

Fabrics:

Creamy muslin: NOT WHITE: two 2" x 5 1/2" and two 2" x 4"

Blue & cream: two 2" x 5 ½" and two 2" x 4" Dark blue: two 1 ½" x 5 ½" and two 1 ½" x 7 ½"

Light blue: two 3" x 3" squares Medium: two 3" x 3" squares

Sewing: all seams are 1/4"

Center: Using the medium and light blue squares, make a four patch with like colors opposite each other. Press the pairs toward the medium. Press the row to one side. The pieced four-patch must measure 5 ½" x 5 ½".

Inner frame:

Sew a 5 ½" dark blue strip to the top and bottom of the four-patch. Press toward the strip. Sew a 7 ½" strip to the right and left. Press toward he strip and square up to 7 ½".

Outer Frame:

Sew each 2" x 4" cream strip to a blue and cream one to make a long strip. Press toward the blue and cream.

Sew the long strips to the bottom and top of the framed four-patch. WATCH THE PLACEMENT. Make sure you sew on the same side as the shorter side of the inner frame. Press away from the four-patch.

Make two longer strips from the remaining blue & cream and cream 5 ½" pieces. Sew on the sides, matching up the creams to each other in opposite corners. Press away from the center.

To complete:

Square up the block to 10 ½" and sign your name in the seam allowance.
