Business Meeting
Minutes
September 23, 2017

President Theresa Pabon called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

The President welcomed members and guests to the meeting.

Treasurer Connie Brewer reported Guild bank account balance of \$16,094.17. Joan Polakoff moved to accept the report and it was seconded by Shirley Swenson. Membership Chair Jenny Bach: A free year's membership is given to one member drawn from those who registered early. This year the drawing of free membership was won by Janet Iatridis. Jenny accepted membership dues today and will have membership booklets printed by next month's meeting. Seventy members, including four new members, attended today's meeting.

Program: October Workshop: Fourteen people are registered to take the class on La Passacaglia. Class size is limited to twenty.

Block of the Month: Peggy Cahill explained next month's project is to be made from Asian inspired fabric. This month's collection of Snowball blocks was won by: Anita Rowell.

Quilt Challenge: Theresa Pabon introduced a new challenge to stretch our thinking and quilting skills. The challenge is to create a non-pictorial design that can be any shape with a perimeter of 80" or less. The design should not be one large block or a recognizable repeat. It can be any fabric, embellished, appliqued, etc. The piece must have three layers and be quilted. The outside edge does not have to have a traditional binding.

Due date: December meeting.

Charm Squares: Anyone interested in participating in the Charm Square exchange may enter for one month or for the year. If interested, please bring to the next meeting, the designated number of 6-1/2 x 6-1/2 inch squares in fall fabric, cut from the same fabric.

MOPS (Miles of Pillowcase Smiles): On Wednesday, September 27, from 10-2 please come to the Grace Church to work on pillowcases for kids in Albany Med, Ronald McDonald House, VA hospitals (adults here) and other area facilities. Pillowcase kits will be cut and ready to sew.

The opening reception of a display of Quilts by Pat Clark is today at the Erpf Gallery in Arkville. Te Pabon offered one spot in her car if anyone would like a ride to the reception.

Charm Squares

Fifteen members are signed up for the October charm square exchange: Rowell, Carl, Boice, Williams, Conlon, Doyle, Slakopa, McPeck, Thorpe-Clark, Repko, Armour, Maceyak, Urbom, Stepp, and Levanway.

You may sign up for the entire year or month by month (as your interest dictates). Stop by the charm square table at the next meeting if you haven't yet signed up, but would like to do so.

The guidelines are the same as in the past: prewashed, new fabric, cut into 6 1/2" squares, no selvedge, no novelty, unless specifically requested. Bring your squares in each month with your quart-size zippered bag, labeled with your name.

The fabrics for the upcoming season are listed below. See you in October. Any questions just email Linda Armour or Alice Maceyak.

Oct: fall leaves: red or orange or yellow or green or brown or combo
Nov: cardinals or holly berries or poinsettias
Dec: snowflakes
Jan: batik
Feb: blender green
