### **Charm Squares**

Twelve charm members are signed up for the February green blender charm square exchange: Armour, Boice, Carl, Conlon, Doyle, Levanway, McLaughlin, McPeck, Rowell, Slakoper, Thorpe-Clark, Williams. The guidelines are the same as in the past: prewashed, new fabric, cut into 6 1/2" squares, no glitter, no selvedge, no novelty, unless specifically requested. Bring your squares in each month with your quart-size zippered bag, labeled with your name.

As usual, anyone not signed up may still sign up for the remainder of the year or month by-month (as your

interest dictates). Stop by the charm square table at the next meeting if you would like to do so. The remaining fabrics for this season are: Mar: I spy, Apr: a solid primary color (red, yellow, or blue), May: vines, June: blue and white with star.

### February In-House Workshops:

Beading- Cheryl Kosarek 6/10. \$5 fee. Exec Mting rm  
Walker Pockets - Sam Conlon 10 Class next to kitchen  
Cathedral Window - Anita Rowell 4 Sanctuary  
Casserole Carrier- Betty VerHoeven 2 (?). Sanctuary  
Snippets- Theresa Pabon 10. Class across from office

1. "Walker Pockets Simplified"- Sam Conlon will teach an easier version of walker pockets they are good for disabled people and that the guild gives to nursing homes. Home décor fabric works especially well, but cotton is fine.
2. "Casserole Carrier" – Betty Verhoeven will show us how to make a square carrier that has a stable bottom and dowels for handles.
3. "Triangular Bowl" – Erika Assimus will teach how to sew this 3-sided bowl/candy dish can makes a good gift and can be made in seasonal colors.
4. "Hand Beading" – Cheryl Kosarek will teach how to make beaded fringe and to cage cabochons. This workshop is limited to 10 people and has materials provided for \$5 fee.
5. "Small Snips Quilt" – Theresa Pabon will guide us thru cutting tiny pieces of fabric to reproduce a simple 12x12 simplified picture/card.
