Thanks to those who shared their favorite "tools". I wish I could remember them all. They were clever, useful and fun things used in unexpected ways.

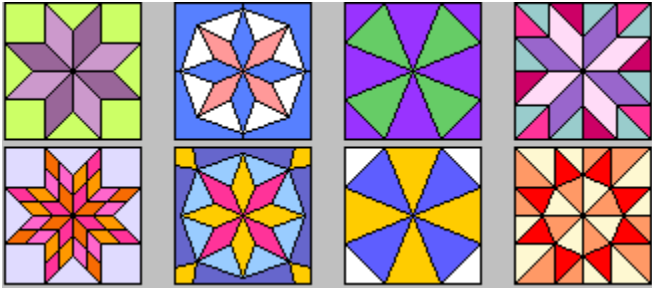
Finally we shared food and conversation at our holiday feast.

The 500 is one of the first embroidery-only machines. They are little work-horses so being now nearly 15-20 years old shouldn't matter. The Deco 500 was made for Bernina (Bernette) by Brother. The machine will only takes "memory cards" in the PES format. Good news is they have gone way down in price for used. They run around \$199. Your manual will get you started with it as they are very easy to use. There are many books on hooping properly and types of stabilizers. Again--I'd rely on your local dealer to point you in the right direction for initial supplies. Price is \$199 or best offer. Best offer should acknowledge that there are many memory cards and hoops, with the sale.
