
BLOCK OF THE MONTH

WILTWYCK QUILTER'S GUILD: Block of the Month

September 2019: Unbiased Block

We will make a 10 1/2" pieced block stabilized with fusible interfacing. It is taken from Quilters Newsletter April/May 2012 on p. 50 and designed by Anita Grossman Solomon.

- Fabrics: 1) Two identical 8 1/2" squares of an autumn color (gold, red, brown, yellow) in a STRIPE or STRIPE PATTERN
2) Two 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips of fusible interfacing



READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. MAKE A PRACTCE BLOCK FIRST.

ASSEMBLY

1 Position the two 8 1/2" squares of fabric wrong side up with the stripes running vertically. Be sure the position of the stripes match for both squares. Fuse a 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" strip of fusible interfacing diagonally from lower left to upper right of each fabric square.

2 Turn the left square right side up. Rotate it so the stripes run horizontally. Be sure the stripe that runs along the bottom of the left square is the same stripe that runs along the left side of the right square.

3 Slide the right square onto the top of the left square, right sides together, aligning raw edges.

4 Join the 2 stacked squares in a continuous 1/4" seam pivoting at the corner (red dot) and backstitching at the beginning and end of the seam. **Note:** The seam begins at a non-interfaced corner, pivots at an interfaced corner and ends at a non-interfaced corner.


5 Cut the squares diagonally from the bottom left corner to the top right corner along the center of the fused interfacing.

6 Open the units and press the seams open. Square up the long sides perpendicular to the seam.

7 Join the two sides with a 1/4" seam, matching the centers. Press the seams open.

8 Square up the block to 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" by aligning the 4 corners of a 10 1/2" square ruler over the seam lines. Q

Sign your name in the seam allowance.
