Dresden Plate Centerpiece

Approximate finished size: 19½" round or 13½" round

Supply List:

Sewing machine in good working order	Seam ripper
¼" presser foot	Pins
Walking (or even feed) presser foot	Good fabric scissors
Darning (or open toe embroidery) presser foot	Chalk pencil
Neutral thread for piecing	#2 pencil
Decorative/variegated thread for machine quilting the Dresden plate center	
Cutting mat, rotary cutter, 6½" x 24½" quilt making ruler	
Purple Thang® or a stiletto - any tool you use to "turn out" a point.	

Fabric Requirements:

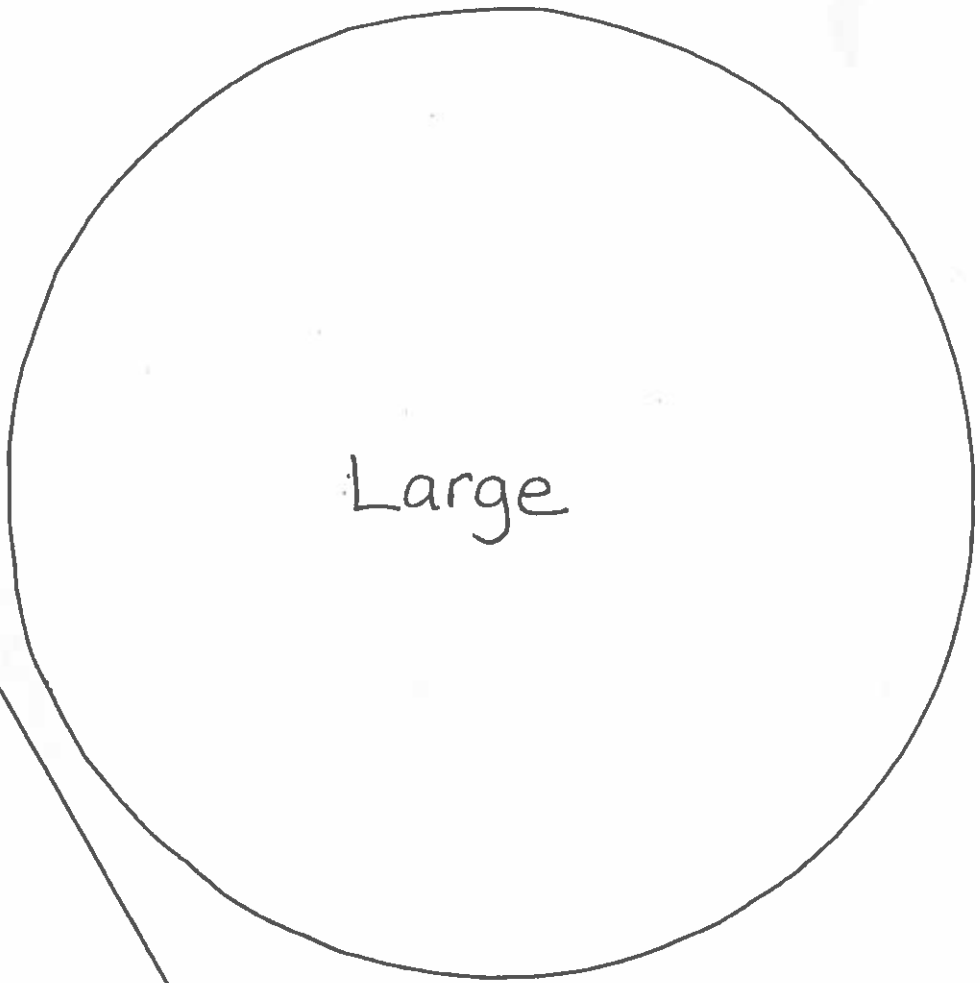
For the large Dresden plate (19½"):

Dresden plate petals:	½ yard of one fabric <u>or</u> ¼ yard each of up to 4 different fabrics
Dresden plate center:	6" square of coordinating or contrasting fabric
Backing:	24" square
Batting:	24" square of a thin batting - if using for hot mat I suggest cotton.

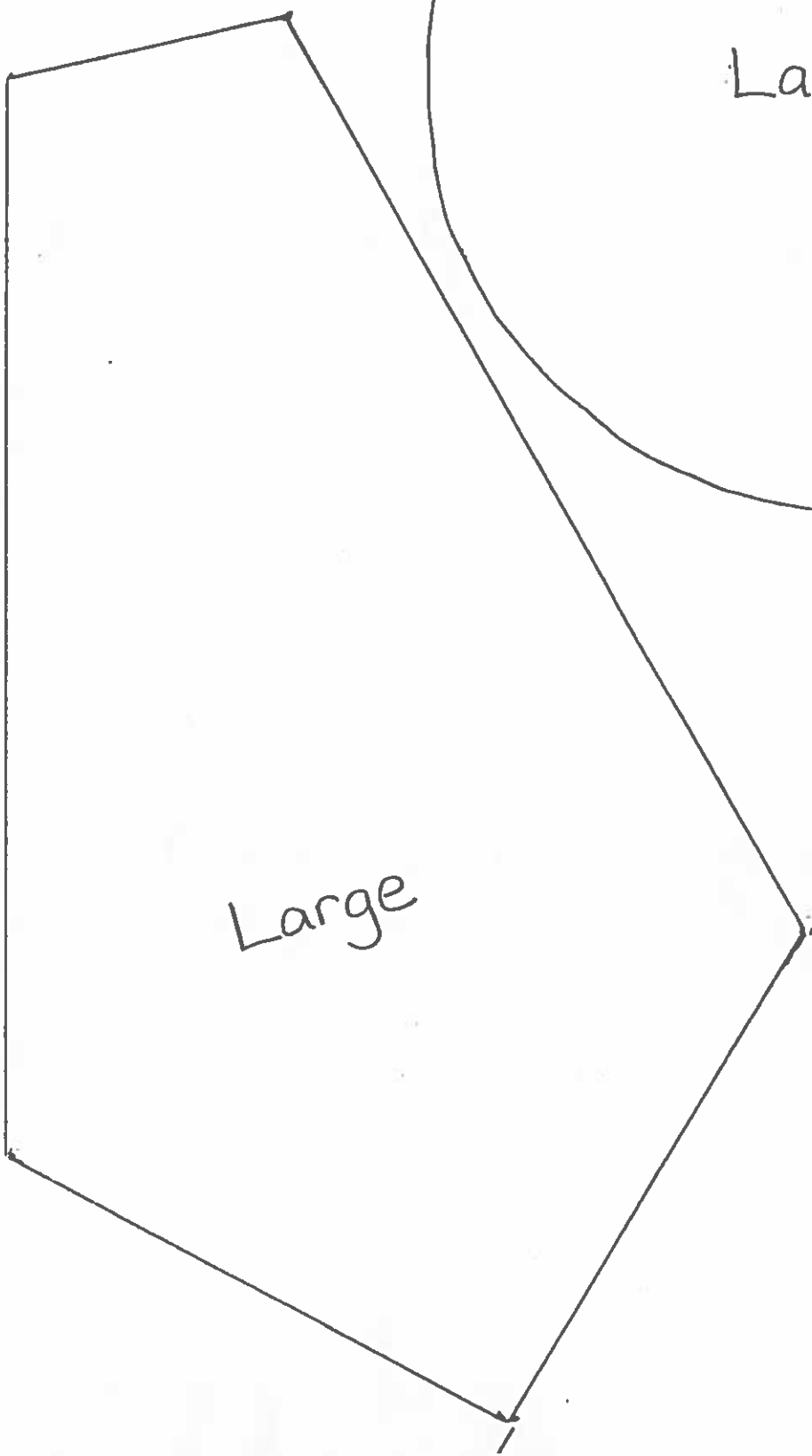
For the small Dresden plate (13½"):

Dresden plate petals:	½ yard of one fabric <u>or</u> ¼ yard each of up to 4 different fabrics
Dresden plate center:	3" square of coordinating or contrasting fabric
Backing:	16" square
Batting:	16" square of a thin batting
