

# <u>Dresden Plate Centerpiece</u>

Approximate finished size:  $19\frac{1}{2}$  round or  $13\frac{1}{2}$  round

## Supply List:

Sewing machine in good working order

Seam ripper

1/4" presser foot

Pins

Walking (or even feed) presser foot

Good fabric scissors

Darning (or open toe embroidery) presser foot

Chalk pencil

Neutral thread for piecing

#2 pencil

Decorative/variegated thread for machine quilting the Dresden plate center

Cutting mat, rotary cutter,  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $24\frac{1}{2}$ " quilt making ruler

Purple Thange or a stiletto - any tool you use to "turn out" a point.

## Fabric Requirements:

## For the large Dresden plate (19\frac{1}{2}"):

Dresden plate petals:

½ yard of one fabric or

½ yard each of up to 4 different fabrics

Dresden plate center:

6" square of coordinating or contrasting fabric

Backing:

24" square

Batting:

24" square of a thin batting -if using for hot mat I sussest cotton.

## For the small Dresden plate (13\frac{1}{2}"):

Dresden plate petals:

½ yard of one fabric or

‡ yard each of up to 4 different fabrics

Dresden plate center:

3" square of coordinating or contrasting fabric

Backing:

16" square

Batting:

15" square of a thin batting
