MYSTERY QUILT

Important: If you haven't already cut your 1 ½" or 1 ½", please wait before doing so.

Also, you will only need two fabric A 3" squares and two fabric D 3" squares, not four. We will be using them to make four half square triangles for each block. If you already cut four A and D squares, you can use some of them in the focal block challenge if you want to. Another option is to use them in a crazy quilt, crumb quilt (which was a very fun class), or scrap quilt.

Finally, If you haven't cut your pieces, wait until you start getting more instructions.

WILTWYCK GUILD CHALLENGE

What's in a name?

What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell just as sweet." ~ William Shakespeare

Think of all the names you know, how many of them relate to flora and beauty in your life? Maybe you know a **Holly**, **Rose** or **Lily**. And of course there may be, **Violet**, **Daphne**, and **Veronica**. Or maybe an **Ivy**, **Daisy**, or **Marigold**.

This year our Wiltwyck Guild Challenge is to create something using a block that is based on flora (flower/plant) that also has a person name in it (in any language). You might decide to create a miniature key tag, a tote bag or wall hanging, or go all the way up to a king size quilt. Maybe you decide to create a whole garden! Let your imagination run wild through your fabric stash!

Challenge: Flora (Flowers/Plants) that are People's names

Size: Anything 1" or larger

Create: anything from one block (or more)

Style: Any (Traditional, Modern, Improv, EPP, foundation pieced, crazy, to name a few)

Pattern: Your choice

Finish date: Fall 2024 to show (details to follow)



BLOCK OF THE MONTH

February 2024

Whirligig

We will make a 10 ½" unfinished block taken from <u>Quilter's</u> <u>World Spring</u> 2022 on pp. 82-64. It was designed by Jennifer Thomas of Curlicue Creations.



READ ALL DIRECTIONS FIRST AND MAKE A PRACTICE BLOCK FIRST. ALL SEAMS ARE 1/2".

HST=half square triangle

FABRICS: 1) White tone-on-tone: four 3 x 5 ½" rectangles and four 4" squares.


2) Pick either a blue print and a red print, or two red prints or two blue prints: two 4" squares of each, whatever scraps you have...

PREPARATION:

- 1) On the four white squares, draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each.
- 2) Layer these, right sides together with two of each color you've picked. Stitch ¼" on either side of the drawn line and cut on the line. Press to the color and square up to 3". You should have FOUR HST of each color you picked paired with the white.

PIECING

- 1) Sew two matching HST units together as shown: Repeat with the three other color pairs.
- 2) Sew a white rectangle to the white side of each of the above units as shown:
