

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

April 2024

Prairie Sunrise

We will make a 10 ½" unfinished block that appears On pp. 75-77 of <u>Quilter's Home</u> and designed by Scott Murkin. You can <u>either</u> of the two blocks: Or make BOTH! Fabrics are the same...



READ ALL DIRECTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. MAKE A PRACTICE BLOCK FIRST. ALL SEAMS ARE 1/2"

Fabrics: 1) Creamy neutral or very pale yellow: four 3" squares = C

- 2) One medium blue print: two 6" squares
- 3) One coordinating dark blue print: two 6" squares

Preparation:

- 1) On the back of the four cream squares, draw a diagonal.
- 2) Cut each of the four blue squares in half diagonally to make four blue triangles.

Making the units:

- 1) Join a medium blue triangle and a dark blue triangle with right sides together and sew on the hypotenuse (the longest side). Press to the darker.
- 2) Place a 3" creamy square on the top left corner AS SHOWN: Make sure the bottom right corner of the square matches the line where the two triangles are sewn.
- 3) Stitch on the marked line. Trim excess fabric ¼" away from the stitched line. Press to the corner.
- 4) SQUARE up to 5 ½") lay the piece out as shown and put the 45 line on the diagonal stitched seam.
- 5) Make three more of these identical units keeping the two blues in the same order.

Making the block:

Lay out the four units as shown for each block: Sew together and press in the direction of the arrows.
