GARDEN GLORY (Quilt 2) Page 1

Materials

1/2 yard	Frogs - White (A)	8682-01
1/2 yard	Fusion Illusion - Orchid (B)	4564-Orchid
1/2 yard	Ladybugs - Green (C)	8685-66*
1/2 yard	Garden Allover - Purple (D)	8680-55
1/2 yard	Butterflies - Blue (E)	8683-77
1/2 yard	Fusion Illusion - Sunshine (F)	4566-Sunshine
1/2 yard	Splash - Ice (H)	3504-Ice
2 yards	Stripes - Lt. Green (I)	8681-65
3 1/2 yards	Birdhouses - Lt. Green (backing)	8686-65

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please make all strips cut across the width of fabric (WOF), from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Frogs - White (A), cut:

- (4) Template 1 blocks.

From the Fusion Illusion - Orchid (B), cut:

- See instructions to cut (4) holes.

From the Ladybugs - Green (C), cut:

- (2) 3 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (6) 3 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (6) 1 1/2" x 9 1/2" strips.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Garden Allover - Purple (D), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (24) 5" squares.

From the Butterflies - Blue (E), cut:

- (2) Template 1 blocks.

From the Fusion Illusion - Sunshine (F), cut:

- (2) Template 1 blocks.

From the Splash - Ice (H), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 1/2" WOF strips.
- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (12) 3 1/2" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (12) 2" x 4" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (12) 2" x 2 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (24) 2" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (12) 2" x 12 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (12) 1 1/2" x 9 1/2" strips.
- (6) Template 2 triangles.
- (6) Template 1 triangles.

Sewing Instructions

- Place (1) Fabric H Template 2 triangle on top of (1) Fabric A Template 1 block, right sides together, aligning the left sides (Fig. 1). Sew the (2) triangles together along the left side. Press the small triangle open.
- Place (1) Fabric H Template 3 triangle on top of the Fabric A Template 1 block, right sides together, aligning the right sides (Fig. 2). Sew the (2) triangles together along the right side. Press the small triangle open to make (1) Unit 1 block (Fig. 3). Trim the block to measure 9 1/2" x 8".
- Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (4) Unit 1 blocks total.
- Repeat Steps 1-2 using (2) Fabric E Template 1 blocks, (2) Fabric H Template 2 triangles and (2) Fabric H Template 3 triangles to make (2) Unit 2 blocks (Fig. 4).

GARDEN GLORY (Quilt 2) Page 2

- Place (1) 3 1/2" Fabric H square on the left side of (1) 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 6). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/8" seam allowance.
- Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (6) Unit 3 strips total.
- Place another 3 1/2" Fabric H square on the right side of the 3 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/8" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 8).
- Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (6) Unit 3 strips total.
- Place (1) 2" x 5" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) 2" x 2 1/2" Fabric G strip to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (6) Unit 4 strips total.
- Place (1) 2" x 8" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 block. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the top of the Unit 1 block. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to the bottom of the Unit 1 block to make (1) Birdhouse Block (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (4) Birdhouse Blocks total.
- Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the fused number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
- Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- Refer to Figure 11 to arrange and press (1) Fabric B hole into (1) Birdhouse Block.
- Finish the raw edges of the shape with a decorative stitch such as a hutchbush or satin stitch to make (1) Block One (Fig. 11).
- Repeat Steps 12-13 to make (4) Block Ones total.
- Repeat Steps 9-13 to make (2) Block Twos using Figure 12 for fabric identification and location.
- Place (1) 2 1/2" Fabric H square on the bottom left corner of (1) 5" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 13). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 13). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 14). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/8" away from the sewn seam.

GARDEN GLORY (Quilt 2) Page 3

- Follow Figure 15 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric H square to the upper right corner of the 5" Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 5 Block (Fig. 16).
- Repeat Steps 16-17 to make (6) Unit 5 blocks total.
- Repeat Steps 16-17 and use Figures 17-19 for fabric identification, location and direction to make (4) Unit 6 blocks, (6) Unit 7 blocks and (6) Unit 8 blocks.
- Follow Figure 20 to sew (1) Unit 5 block (1) Unit 6 block, (1) Unit 7 strip and (1) Unit 8 block and (1) 1 1/2" x 9 1/2" Fabric C strip together to make (1) Butterfly block. Repeat to make (6) Butterfly blocks total.
- Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 9 1/2" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Butterfly block. Sew (1) 2" x 12 1/2" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Butterfly block to make (1) Block Three (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (6) Block Threes total.
- Center (1) 6" x 66" Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/8" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/2" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- Repeat Step 26 to sew (1) 6" x 54" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/8" away from each end of the block. To finish each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 22).
- Starting at the sewn seam represented by the arrow in Figure 22, draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/2" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.
- Layer and quilt as desired.
- Sew the (6) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- Bind as desired.

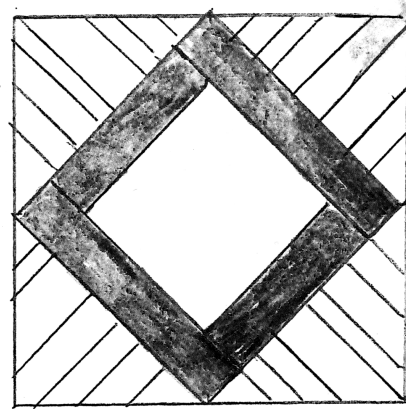
Quilt Layout

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

May 2024

FOLKLORE

We will make a 10 1/2" pieced and unfinished block
Which appeared in Fon's & Porter's Love of Quilting
Jan/Feb 2010 on pp. 48-52. It was designed by
Kim Schaefer.



READ ALL DIRECTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. MAKE A PRACTICE BLOCK FIRST...

All seams are 1/4"

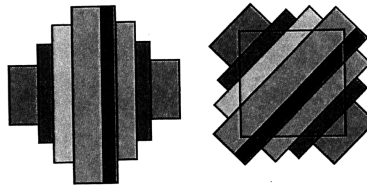
FABRICS: 1) Black floral: 4 5/8" square (Provided from Grace Moone from her mother's fabrics)

2) Black tone-on-tone or solid: two rectangles, 2" x 4 5/8", two rectangles 2" x 7 5/8"

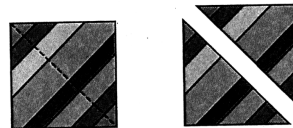
3) Brightly colored rectangles ranging in width from 1" to 2" and four of each in the lengths of: 9", 7", 5", 3" at least. You can use a variety of scraps in purples, pinks, or greens OR you can use one color family (for ex. all purples)

Block Assembly

1) Choose two 9" rectangles, two 7" rectangles, two 5" rectangles and two 3" rectangles. Join together as shown and press in one direction. This unit needs to be at least 8 3/8" in width.



2) Place a 5 7/8" square template or ruler atop this unit and draw around the template or cut using a square-up ruler. Cut this square in half diagonally.

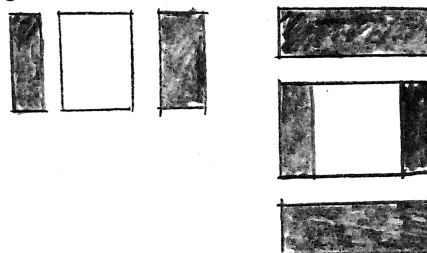


HANDLE THIS BLOCK CAREFULLY SINCE EDGES ARE CUT ON THE BIAS.....

Corner Unit Diagrams

Repeat this unit with the other set of 9", 7", 5" and 3" rectangles to make four large bias triangles.

3) On opposite sides of the 4 5/8" square, place a black 2" x 4 5/8" rectangle and stitch. Press to the black. On the other pair of opposite sides, place the 2" x 7 5/8" rectangles and stitch. Press to the black to make a "frame". Square up to 7 5/8" "



4) Join two corner triangle units made in #1, & #2 to opposite sides of the frame as shown. Press to the triangle unit. Then take the second pair of triangle units and attach to the other pair of opposite sides and press to the triangle units.

5) SQUARE UP TO 10 1/2" AND SIGN YOUR NAME IN THE SEAM ALLOWANCE. Bring to the June meeting or mail to Mary McLaughlin at 212 Dogwood Lane, Kingston, NY 12401
